Bank of America Robbery Suspect Sought

On March 24, 2010 shortly after 0800 hours, the Bank of America located on North Shangri-La Drive in Lexington Park was robbed of an undisclosed amount of money. The suspect fled the bank in a blue/green Acura. The Acura has since been located and the suspects were last seen driving a black sedan similar to an Acura. The suspects are described as two black males, one wearing a green flight suit and the other wearing a light gray hooded sweat shirt and ski mask. A handgun was displayed during the robbery.

The intersection of Maryland Route 235 and Maryland Route 4 was initially closed to all traffic but has since been reopened. Detectives from the St. Mary's County Bureau of Criminal Investigations responded to the scene and assumed the investigation. Below is a photograph of one of the suspects.
