Graduation was held at North Point High School in Charles County Maryland on January 22, 2010.

Five of the seven officers were recognized as distinguished graduates. A distinguished graduate is an officer who completes the training program with an overall grade point average of 95% or higher. St. Mary's County Correctional Officer Randall D. Molitor received the Scholastic Achievement Award graduating with the highest class grade point average of 97.8%. C.O. Molitor was also chosen by his classmates to deliver the class address at the ceremony.
