St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office Crime Report for January 9, 2012

On December 21, 2012, deputies responded to the Wal-Mart on Miramar Way, California, Maryland, for theft report. Investigation revealed a Wal-Mart Loss Prevention Specialist observed Amanda Lynn Abell, 29, of Leonardtown, Maryland, conceal merchandise in a bag and attempt to exit the store without paying for the items. The Loss Prevention Specialist detained Abell until police arrival. Deputy Bankhead arrested Abell and charged her with theft.

On December 22, 2011, deputies responded to a residence on Foxchase Drive, Lexington Park, Maryland, for an assault report. Investigation revealed Garry Victor Shubrooks became upset with the victim. Shubrooks pushed the victim onto a couch and punched the victim in the face. Deputy Schultz arrived and placed Shubrooks under arrest. Shubrooks was charged with Second Degree Assault.

On December 29, 2011, deputies responded to a residence on Blake Creek Road, Leonardtown, Maryland, for an assault report. Investigation revealed Lakisha Rena Rhodes, 33, of Leonardtown, Maryland, became involved in an argument with the victim which escalated into a physical assault when Rhodes struck the victim in the face. Deputy Potter arrested Rhodes and charged her with Second Degree Assault.

On December 20, 2011, deputies responded to a residence on Meadowlake Court, Great Mills, Maryland, for a burglary report. Investigation revealed Zachary Scott Llewellyn, 20, of Hollywood, Maryland, forced entry into the residence and stole items from within. Corporal Corcoran arrived and observed Llewellyn fleeing in a vehicle from the driveway. Corporal Corcoran arrested Llewellyn and charged him with First Degree Burglary and Theft.

On December 30, 2011, deputies responded to a residence on Valley Estates Drive, Lexington Park, Maryland, for a report of a fight. Deputy Schultz arrived and observed Detective Raddatz interviewing Derrick Xavier Green, 30, of Lexington Park, Maryland. Green was yelling and speaking loudly and was asked by Detective Raddatz to quiet down and leave the area. Green refused and continued to speak loudly causing a disturbance to other residents in the area. Deputy Schultz arrested Green and charged him with Disorderly Conduct.

On December 31, 2011, deputies responded to a residence on North Patuxent Beach Road, California, Maryland, for an assault report. Investigation revealed Thomas Ray Pacobit, 46, of California, Maryland, became involved in an argument with the victim which escalated into a physical assault when Pacobit struck the victim in the head several times. Deputy Ellis arrested Pacobit and charged him with Second Degree Assault.

On January 1, 2012, deputies responded to a residence on Weeping Willow Lane, Lexington Park, Maryland, for an assault report. Investigation revealed Christopher Michael Roby, 34, of Lexington Park, Maryland, became involved in an argument with the victim which escalated into an assault when Roby pushed, strangled and bit the victim. Deputy Schultz arrested Roby and charged him with Second Degree Assault.

On January 1, 2012, deputies responded to a local bar on Budds Creek Road, Clements, Maryland, for a report of a fight. Officers arrived and observed a large crowd involved in a fight. Several officers issued multiple commands for the crowd to stop. No one in the crowd complied with the commands. Deputy Schultz witnessed Alan Richard Courtney engaged in the altercation. Multiple orders were given to Courtney to stop which he refused. Since Courtney refused to stop, Deputy Schultz deployed his Taser to subdue Courtney. Courtney was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

On January 2, 2012, deputies responded to a residence on Alice Way, Clements, Maryland, for a report of assault. Investigation revealed Kenneth James Dickerson, 27, of Clements, Maryland, became involved in an argument which escalated into a physical assault when Dickerson pushed the victim into a wall. Deputy Adamo arrested Dickerson and charged him with Second Degree Assault.

On January 2, 2012, Kenneth James Dickerson, 27, of Clements, Maryland, was served with a Protective Order ordering that he have no contact with the Petitioner of the order. On January 2, 2012, the petitioner contacted Deputy Krum and reported Dickerson had contacted a third party to deliver a message to the petitioner which is a violation of the order. Deputy Krum located Dickerson a short time later and charged with a Protective Order Violation.

On January 2, 2012, deputies responded to a residence on Valley Estates Drive, Lexington Park, Maryland, for an assault report. Investigation revealed McKinley Nathaniel Mackall, 32, of Lexington Park, Maryland, became involved in an argument with the victim which escalated into a physical assault when Mackall grabbed the defendant and pulled out her hair. Deputy Green arrested Mackall and charged him with Second Degree Assault.

On January 3, 2012, deputies responded to a residence on Silver Slate Drive, Lexington Park, Maryland, for a report of an assault. Investigation revealed Joseph W. Custalow, 28, of Lexington Park, Maryland, became involved in an argument which escalated into a physical assault when Custalow pushed the victim down the stairs. Deputy Beyer arrested Custalow and charged him with Second Degree Assault.

The St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office Vice Narcotics Division and Support Team members were assisted by Patrol and Special Operations Deputies as they conducted an operation which targeted wanted narcotics traffickers.

Kenneth Edward Miller (Age 46 of Lexington Park) was indicted by vice narcotics detectives for "Possession with Intent to Distribute Cocaine". An arrest warrant was issued by the St. Mary's County Grand Jury. Vice Narcotics Support Team Deputies located suspect Miller and he was placed under arrest. He was found to be in possession of more than \$5,100 worth of cocaine, \$5,281 in cash and a scale. Also seized were counterfeit money and a cellular phone. Additional charges were placed on Suspect Miller and more charges are pending a State's Attorney's Office review.

Jason Anthony Hoover (Age 23 of Charlotte Hall), John Robert Garner (Age 30 of Bedford, Va.) and Jesse Patrick Goble (Age 22 of Mechanicsville) were identified as major distributors of prescription medication throughout St. Mary's County. The three suspects, along with others were responsible for thousands of "Oxycodone" being falsely obtained and distributed. There are other

suspects still at large. Suspect Hoover, Garner and Goble were arrested on open indictments for the drug violations and were originally held without bond.

Carrie Anne Conyers (Age 24 Delray Beach, Fl) was indicted for "Distribution of Cocaine" and "Conspiring to Distribute Cocaine". She was also served with a "Failure to Appear Warrant on the original charge of Theft".

Delwin Matthew Thomas (Age 35 of Lexington Park) was indicted by vice narcotics detectives after being found with a sufficient quantity of cocaine to indicate intent to distribute.

Robert Edward Blake aka "Country" (Age 28 of Leonardtown) was arrested on an open warrant that was obtained by vice narcotics detectives through the Grand Jury process. Suspect Blake was charged with "Possession with the intent to Distribute Cocaine" as well as "Conspiring to Distribute Cocaine".

Edgar Charles Brockman (Age 43 of Lexington Park) was arrested on an open warrant for "Possession of Oxycodone with the intent to Distribute". He was originally held without bond.

Tory Dinone Herbert (Age 26 of Leonardtown, Md) was arrested on numerous handgun charges that were handed down by the St. Mary's County Grand Jury as well as "Failure to Appear" warrant that were issued through the District Court.

On January 4, 2012, deputies responded to a local hotel in Lexington Park, Maryland, for a stalking report. Investigation revealed Ivan Earl Nealy, 33, of Bushwood, Maryland, repeatedly contacted the victim by calling the victim after Nealy was told by the victim to stop. Nealy twice violated active protective orders on December 29, 2011 and January 4, 2012, which the victim was the petitioner. Nealy also contacted and threatened the victim prior to police arrival. The further revealed that Nealy was attempting to intimidate the victim in an effort to keep the victim from testifying against him in court. Nealy was located and charged with Stalking, Harassment and Witness Intimidation.

On January 6, 2012, deputies responded to a residence on Flower Drive in Lexington Park, Maryland, for a theft report. Investigation revealed Creighton Shields Perkins, 28, of California, Maryland, went to the victim's residence causing a disturbance. Perkins became angry when the victim told him to leave and Perkins stole the victim's mailbox and broke the side view mirror off the victim's vehicle. Deputy Wood located Perkins a short time later and arrested him. Perkins was charged with Theft and Malicious Destruction of Property.

Between May, 2011 and August, 2011 Police units responded too numerous night time burglaries of occupied residences, motor vehicles and theft of vehicles in the California, Great Mills and Lexington Park areas. BCI assumed the investigation, developed suspects in the cases and on January 4, 2012 presented the cases to a St. Mary's County Grand Jury. As a result, the Grand Jury returned an indictment on Jermaine S. Greenwell, age 20, of Great Mill's, Maryland charging him with the following: 9 counts of 1st Degree Burglary, 4 counts of Theft \$1000.00 to \$10,000.00, 1 count of Theft \$10,000.00 to \$100,000.00, 5 counts of Theft under \$1000.00, 3 counts of Rogue and Vagabond (Burglary to Motor Vehicle), 3 counts of Theft under \$100.00, 1 count of Theft Scheme \$10,000.00 to \$100,000.00, 1 count of Conspiracy to Commit Burglary, and 1 count of Conspiracy to Commit Rogue and Vagabond. On January 6, 2012 Greenwell was located, placed under arrest and incarcerated in the St. Mary's County Detention Center with no bond pending an appearance before the Circuit Court.

On January 6, 2012 at 7:09 PM St. Mary's deputies responded to a serious motor vehicle collision involving a pedestrian on Indian Bridge Road in the area of Knotts Drive in California, Maryland. Arriving deputies found Dennis Mark Todd, 51 of California, Maryland deceased in the roadway. The St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office Crash Reconstruction Team responded to the scene to assume the investigation. Preliminary investigation revealed Mr. Todd was attempting to start his

1995 Mazda B3000 pick up truck by pushing it into Indian Bridge Road. Mr. Todd was outside of his vehicle in the door jamb pushing the driver less vehicle. It appears Mr. Todd was attempting to gain enough speed to jump into the truck and pop the clutch to start it. Mr. Todd was wearing dark clothing and no lights illuminated his truck as it entered southbound lane # 1 of Indian Bridge Road. Mr. Todd was either stopped in the roadway or attempting to push his truck into southbound lane # 1 when a southbound 2007 Hyundai Tiburon, operated by Joan Louise Farrar, 55 of Tall Timbers, Maryland approached. Mrs. Farrar noticed the truck in the roadway a short distance away and attempted to avoid striking it by swerving into the northbound lane, however there was oncoming traffic. Mrs. Farrar swerved back into the southbound lane and struck the Mazda truck while Mr. Todd was in the door jamb area. Mr. Todd was pronounced dead on the scene. At this time speed, alcohol and/or drugs do not appear to be contributing factors to the crash. On January 7, 2012 deputies responded to a residence on Yourktown Road in Lexington Park, Maryland for the report of a disturbance. Investigation revealed James Errick Barnes, 40 of Lexington Park, Maryland was engaged in a verbal dispute with the victim which escalated into a physical assault when Barnes shoved the victim into a door and pulled the victim's hair. Barnes was arrested and charged with second degree assault.
