### **St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office Crime Report for April 26, 2010**

On April 14, 2010, Deputy T. Snyder responded to a suspicious vehicle call on Dudley Road in Mechanicsville. Upon arrival, he located a red Dodge Caravan occupied multiple times. Further investigation revealed the occupants were in possession of suspected marijuana and related paraphernalia. A 16-year-old female from Charlotte Hall and a 17-year-old female from Morganza were charged with Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Paraphernalia. The juveniles were released to their guardians pending a review by the Department of Juvenile Justice. John A. Trexler, age 25 of La Plata, was arrested and charged with Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Paraphernalia and Possession of Diazepam. Trexler was released to the custody of the St. Mary's County Detention Center pending an appearance before the District Court Commissioner.

On April 15, 2010, Deputy First Class J. Maletto and Sergeant J. Schwab responded to a residence in Great Mills for a disturbance. Officers learned Kyle W. Hinchman, age 23 of Great Mills, became involved in an argument with the victim over the use of a vehicle. During the argument, Hinchman pulled the victim from the driver's seat to the ground causing visible signs of injury. Hinchman fled the scene prior to police arrival but was located nearby by Sergeant Schwab and arrested. Hinchman was charged with Second Degree Assault and released to the custody of the St. Mary's County Detention Center pending an appearance before the District Court Commissioner.

On April 16, 2010, deputies responded to the parking lot of St. Francis Xavier Church in Leonardtown for a disturbance. Upon arrival, Deputy T. Snyder learned Terrill A. Terry Sr., age 39 of Leonardtown, assaulted three separate victims. During the investigation, Terry had been asked to leave on more than one occasion but refused. He was subsequently arrested and charged with one count of First Degree Assault, three counts of Second Degree Assault, Disorderly Conduct, Obstructing/Hindering and Failure to Obey Reasonable Order From a Law Enforcement Officer.

While officers were investigating the above mentioned assaults, Terrill A. Terry Jr., age 19 of St. Leonard, became involved in an argument with Louis I. Berry, age 42 of Leonardtown. Both subjects failed to heed law enforcement officers' orders to stop yelling and leave the area and were subsequently arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct, Obstruction/Hindering and Failure to Obey a Reasonable Order From a Law Enforcement Officer.

On April 17, 2010, Deputy First Class C. Dodson observed smoke coming from a cement structure in the Exploration Park Business Center in Lexington Park. Further investigation

revealed Antron Somerville, age 25 of no fixed address, and Brian Chrismond, age 30 of no fixed address, had started a fire to a trash container to stay warm. Chrismond and Somerville were arrested and charged with Arson (trash container). During the arson investigation, Somerville was found in possession of a GPS unit and car charger. Deputies checked parking lots in the area for potential burglary victims and located the owner of the GPS unit who was staying in a nearby hotel. The victim's vehicle had been entered while parked in the lot and their GPS unit stolen. Somerville was charged with Theft Under \$1,000.00 and Rogue and Vagabond.

On April 17, 2010, Deputy M. Green responded to the Sotterly Plantation for a report of a theft. Deputy Green learned Tiffany L. Richards, age 19 of Lusby, entered an unsecured vehicle in the parking lot and removed a purse. Additionally, Richards removed cash and a credit card from another victim's purse which had been left in an office at the plantation. Richards was arrested and charged with two counts of Theft Under \$1,000.00, Rogue and Vagabond and Theft of the Credit Card.

On April 17, 2010, Corporal B. Connelly found a vehicle in the parking lot of the Helen Post Office with the vehicle running, the operator unresponsive and a baggie containing suspected cocaine and several pills on his lap. The occupant/operator David T. Dillow, age 24 of Hollywood, was awakened, given a standardized field sobriety test and arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Drugs, Possession of Cocaine, Possession of Methadone, Possession of Oxycotin, Possession of Alprazolam and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

On April 17, 2010, deputies responded to a motor vehicle accident involving a pedestrian which occurred in a private driveway on William Franklin Drive in Valley Lee. It was learned Jason David Everhart, age 33 of Great Mills, was pulling out of a private drive in a 1997 Chevrolet 1500 when he struck the victim, a 19-month-old female. The victim was transported by Maryland State Police Helicopter Trooper 7 to Children's Hospital where she succumbed to her injuries. The accident investigation is being conducted by Corporal B. Connelly of the Sheriff's Office Accident Reconstruction Team.

On April 20, 2010, Deputy First Class T. Reese responded to J.C. Penney in California for a theft. Deputy First Class Reese learned Mary J.L. Fulks, age 18 of Lusby, was observed by store staff attempting to leave the business with unpaid merchandise totaling \$54.00. Fulks was charged on a Criminal Citation for Theft Under \$100.00.

On April 20, 2010, Deputy A. Perkins responded to McKay's Food Store in Charlotte Hall for a theft. Deputy Perkins learned Cecil M. Green, age 47 of Springfield, Virginia, was observed by store staff concealing food items on his person. Green was confronted and a frozen dinner, mashed potatoes and gravy were recovered. Green was arrested and a further search revealed him to be in possession of counterfeit currency and suspected crack cocaine. Green was charged with Theft Under \$100.00, Possession of Counterfeit Currency and Possession of Crack Cocaine. He was released to the custody of the St. Mary's County Detention Center pending an appearance before the District Court Commissioner.

On April 21, 2010, Deputy C. Ellis and Deputy M. Boyer responded to a residence in Lexington Park for a disturbance. Upon arrival, Deputy Ellis learned Joshua J. Yates, age 20 of Lexington Park, had become involved in a disagreement with the home owner. Yates agreed to leave however, while Yates was entering a vehicle, Deputy Boyer observed a bag containing suspected marijuana fall to the ground. Yates was arrested and charged with Possession of Marijuana.

On December 19, 2007, deputies responded to the Bank of America in Lexington Park for the report of an armed robbery. Investigation by Detectives from the Bureau of Criminal Investigations revealed the victim was approached by a male subject, armed with a large knife, while making a withdrawal from the ATM. The suspect demanded money from the victim and a struggle ensued. The victim received minor lacerations as a result of the struggle. A large knife

was recovered from the scene and submitted for DNA testing. A DNA standard was collected from the handle of the knife and entered into a DNA Database. Recently, a search of the DNA Database resulted in a DNA match to Antonio Jamear Warrick, age 20 of Lexington Park. Warrick is currently incarcerated in the Eastern Correctional Institute in Westover, Maryland on unrelated charges. On April 21, 2010, Warrick was served with an Arrest Warrant charging him with Armed Robbery and Assault Second Degree. Warrick remains incarcerated at ECI.

On April 21, 2010, Corporal J. Logalbo responded to a report of a disturbance at the Fox Chase Apartments in Great Mills. The investigation revealed Matthew Anthony Brown Sr., age 48 of Great Mills, was involved in a verbal dispute with another resident of the apartment complex. Brown was extremely agitated and was yelling causing neighbors to look out side of their windows and doors to see what was causing the disturbance. Deputies asked Brown several times to calm down and stop yelling which he refused. Brown was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct.

On April 22, 2010, deputies responded to the Sheetz Store in Great Mills for a report of a large crowd and fight. Corporal P. Handy and Corporal K. Moritz observed Ineisha Nat'e Young, age 20 of Great Mills, and Angel Marie Mawson, age 27 of Lexington Park, yelling and cursing at one another from across the in parking lot. It was obvious to the deputies the two women were the primary aggressors and their actions were causing the crowd of fifty-plus people to grow thus endangering public safety. The women were ordered by deputies to stop their disorderly behavior but both refused. The deputies believed a physical altercation was going to ensue. Corporal Handy approached Young, told her she was under arrest and took her by the arm. Young attempted to pull away from Corporal Handy's grasp and yelled "I ain't going nowhere." Corporal Handy placed Young on the ground and handcuffed her. Corporal Moritz arrested Mawson. Both were charged with Disorderly Conduct. Young was additionally charged with Resisting Arrest.
