St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office Crime Report for March 15, 2010

On March 4, 2010 Correctional Officer First Class M. Grimes was conducting cell inspections and discovered the cell door located in B-Pod, Dayroom 4, Cell B of the St. Mary's County Detention Center was damaged. The investigation revealed John Anthony Supensky, age 39 of Great Mills, had access to the cell door. Supensky was charged with Malicious Destruction of Property Having a Damage Value of More Than \$500.00.

On March 6, 2010 at 2335 hours, Patrol Units responded for the report of a shooting on Oakley Road in Avenue. Upon arrival, deputies discovered the victim suffering from a single gunshot wound to the arm. The victim advised he was retrieving mail from a mailbox when a vehicle passed by and an unknown occupant of the vehicle had shot him. Detectives from the Bureau of Criminal Investigations responded and assumed the investigation. As a result of the investigation, detectives were able to determine the victim's injuries were a result of a self-inflicted gunshot wound and no other persons were involved. The victim was transported to St. Mary's Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The investigation is continuing.

On March 6, 2010 Correctional Officer First Class B. Gillingham heard a disturbance coming from Holding Cell E in the booking area of the St. Mary's County Detention Center. Correctional Officer First Class Gillingham investigated and discovered William Samuel Parks Jr., age 18 of Lexington Park, the inmate occupying the cell, soaking wet and water running uncontrollably from the cell's broken sprinkler head. Parks was the sole occupant of the cell. Parks was charged with Destruction of Property Under \$100.00.

On March 6, 2010, Corporal K. Moritz was on routine patrol at Donovan's Pub in California. Corporal Moritz entered the establishment to speak with the manager. While inside of the pub, Corporal Moritz witnessed a disturbance. The security from the pub was escorting Darvus Mennaze Gray, age 27 of Prince Frederick, from the pub. Once outside, Gray attempted to re-enter the pub. Corporal Moritz stepped in front of Gray and told him he was not to re-enter the pub and that the management wanted him to leave. Corporal Moritz was in uniform and easily identified as a police officer. Gray pushed Corporal Moritz. Gray was told he was under arrest and a struggle ensued. Gray was subdued, handcuffed and charged with Second Degree Assault, Disorderly Conduct and Failing to Obey a Lawful Order of a Police Officer.

On March 6, 2010, deputies responded to a residence on Spitfire Court in Lexington Park for a report of a burglary in progress. The investigation revealed Dee Hertis Brown, age 40 of Park Hall, who was disoriented and appeared to be under the influence of an intoxicating

substance, entered the victim's without permission and refused to leave. No one at the residence knew Brown. Brown was arrested and charged with Fourth Degree Burglary.

On March 6, 2010, Deputy M. Rogers responded to a residence on Point Lookout Road in Leonardtown for a report of a domestic assault. The investigation revealed Jeffrey Lawrence Nixon, age 51 of Leonardtown, was intoxicated and according to the victim, for no apparent reason, started throwing steak knives at her. Nixon also picked up a chair, shattered the coffee table and then threw the broken glass at the victim. The victim sustained lacerations to her arm and chest. The victim was able to run out of the residence and called 911. Deputy Rogers located Nixon inside of the residence and arrested him for Second Degree Assault.

On February 26, 2010, Jackie Lynn Ryon Adkins, age 60 of Abell, was served with a Protective Order ordering no contact, by any means, between her and the petitioner of the order. On March 7, 2010, Adkins left a voicemail on the petitioner's answering machine. Adkins was arrested for Violating the Conditions of the Order.

On March 7, 2010, Deputy M. Green responded to an apartment on Great Mills Road in Lexington Park for a report of a trespasser. Deputy Green contacted the complainant who advised there were several individuals occupying an apartment which is vacant. The complainant further advised that no one had permission to be in the apartment. Deputy Green made contact with Carey Michael Anderson, age 29 of no fixed address, inside the apartment. While Deputy Green was interviewing Anderson, she noticed a glass smoking device with suspected cocaine residue. Anderson was arrested and charged with Trespassing, Fourth Degree Burglary, Possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance, suspected cocaine and Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance Paraphernalia.

In February, 2010, Detectives from the Bureau of Criminal Investigations conducted an investigation into complaints of a subject peering into windows of residences during the night-time hours in Helen. On March 8, 2010, a 17-year-old male juvenile from Helen was arrested by Detective/Corporal D. Alexander, charged with two counts of Criminal Trespassing and two counts of Illegal Visual Surveillance with Prurient Intent. Additional charges are pending upon completion of a review of the case with the State's Attorney's Office.

On March 8, 2010, deputies responded to a residence on Thompson Orchard Lane in Lexington Park for a report of an assault. The investigation revealed Gary Lawrence Greinert Jr., age 29 of Lexington Park, was in a verbal dispute with the victim which escalated into a physical assault when Greinert kicked the victim in the leg. Greinert was arrested for Second Degree Assault.

On March 9, 2010, deputies responded to a residence on Columbia Drive in Lexington Park for a report of a domestic assault in progress. As deputies arrived on the scene, they observed Harold Nathaniel White, age 56 of Lexington Park, throw the victim to the ground. As deputies attempted to arrest White, he refused to comply and a brief struggle ensued. Once handcuffed, White began yelling obscenities and threatening the lives of the deputies. White was transported to the St. Mary's County Detention Center where he was charged with Second Degree Assault and Resisting Arrest.

On March 9, 2010, deputies responded to L & G Billiards in Lexington Park for a report of a violation of a Protective Order. The investigation revealed Jackie Lynn Ryon Adkins, age 60 of no fixed address, was served with a Protective Order on March 8, 2010 ordering no contact with the petitioner of the order. The order specifically ordered Adkins to stay away from L & G Billiards in Lexington Park. On March 9, 2010 at approximately 1000 hours, Adkins was waiting outside of L & G Billiards waiting for the petitioner to arrive for work. Adkins left the area when the petitioner called deputies to report the violation. As deputies were exiting L & G Billiards, Adkins walked past the business. Adkins was arrested and charged with Violating the Conditions of the Protective Order.

On March 9, 2010, deputies responded to the Three Oaks Men's Shelter in Lexington Park for a report of a trespasser. The investigation revealed Darrell Duane Jones Jr., age 31 of no fixed address, was served with a No Trespassing Notice for the Three Oaks Men's Shelter on March 8, 2010 by Trooper Mersman of the Maryland State Police. When the deputies arrived at the shelter, Jones was standing in the lobby of the shelter. Jones was arrested and charged with Trespassing.

On March 9, 2010, deputies responded to a residence on Columbus Drive for a report of a domestic assault. The investigation revealed Joseph Edward Ball, age 23 of Lexington Park, was involved in a verbal dispute with the victim which turned physical when Ball kicked the victim in the face. Shortly after the assault, the victim's brother arrived at the residence. The victim's brother saw his sister on the floor bleeding and attempted to render aid. As the brother was attempting to render aid, Ball ran towards him with a wood stove cast iron shovel and attempted to hit the brother and the victim. Ball was tackled by the brother and subdued. Ball was arrested and charged with First and Second Degree Assault.

On March 9, 2010, deputies responded to the Hermanville Mobile for a report of a wanted subject. Deputies located Jeffrey Kirk Berry, age 52 of no fixed address. Berry had two outstanding warrants for his arrest and was arrested. A search of Berry's person revealed a small plastic bag containing suspected cocaine. Berry was charged with Possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance, suspected cocaine.

On March 9, 2010, deputies responded to the Donut Connection for a report of a trespasser. Management at the Donut Connection did not want Brandon Wayne Danchak, age 25 of no fixed address, on the property so Deputy M. Boyer issued Danchak an order not to trespass. On March 10, 2010, Deputy Boyer was patrolling the area of the Donut Connection and observed Danchak standing on the property approximately four feet from the entrance. Danchak was arrested and charged with Trespassing.

On March 10, 2010, deputies responded to Laurel Glen Road Apartments in California for a report of a domestic assault. The investigation revealed Walter Lee Payne III, age 22 of California, was involved in a domestic dispute with the victim, which turned physical when Payne smashed the victim's computer and grabbed the victim by the arms. Payne was arrested and charged with Malicious Destruction of Property and Second Degree Assault.

On March 10, 2010, deputies were flagged down on Route 245 and Leonard Hall Drive in Leonardtown. The investigation revealed Jeffrey Alan Dement, age 45 of Leonardtown, was engaged in a verbal dispute with the victim as they were driving down Route 245. The verbal dispute turned physical when Dement attempted to remove the keys from the ignition of the vehicle as the victim was driving the vehicle. The victim sustained scratches on her shoulder and neck as a result of Dement's assault. Dement was arrested for Second Degree Assault. A search incident to Dement's arrest revealed an aluminum smoking device concealed on his person. Dement was also charged with Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance Paraphernalia.

On March 11, 2010, deputies responded to the McKay's store on Great Mills Road in Lexington Park for a report of a theft. The investigation revealed Shane Deon Collins, age 34 of no fixed address, grabbed the victim's purse from a shopping cart and attempted flee the store. Collins was stopped and detained by McKay's Loss Prevention Officer until deputies arrived. Collins was charged with Theft Under \$1,000.00.
