St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office Crime Report for May 24, 2010

Vice/Narcotics Detectives executed a Search and Seizure Warrant on a Lexington Park home. Once inside cocaine, marijuana and related smoking devices belonging to Mary Louise Milburn, a.k.a. "Weezy", were located. She was charged accordingly and additional charges are pending.

Vice/Narcotics Detectives were conducting an investigation when Sharrie Ann Cutchember, age 21 of Lexington Park, was observed in the parking lot of a Lexington Park gas station. She was removing the tobacco from a cigar and replacing it with marijuana. A uniformed patrol deputy was alerted and a vehicle stop was conducted. A bag of marijuana and a "marijuana blunt" was recovered from Cutchember's person.

Robert Lance Lumpkins, age 22 of Leonardtown, was charged on two separate indictments. One of the indictments was related to a Search and Seizure Warrant that was executed on his home previously. The amount of cocaine that was recovered was in such a quantity that there was intent to distribute. Separately, Vice/Narcotics Detectives have made undercover purchases of marijuana during a lengthy investigation into Lumpkins' drug trafficking. He is released pending an arraignment in the Circuit Court.

Glenn Fitzgerald Fenwick, a.k.a. "Duke", was identified as a distributor of cocaine in the northern end of St. Mary's County. After several investigations concluded, Fenwick was indicted. He was subsequently arrested for Distribution of Cocaine, Possession With the Intent to Distribute Cocaine and Possession of Oxycodone.

On May 17, 2010 Deputy First Class S. Ruest responded to the Kohl's Department Store in Lexington Park for a report of a theft. The investigation revealed Patrick Alphonso Gayle, age 23 of Lexington Park, entered the store, went to the shoe department, took a pair of New Balance shoes from their box and placed them on his feet. Gayle then placed his old shoes in the shoe box and placed the shoe box back on the store shelf. Gayle walked past all points of purchase and attempted to exit the store without paying for the shoes. Gayle was stopped and detained by Kohl's Loss Prevention Officer until Deputy First Class Ruest arrived. Gayle was arrested and charged with Theft Less Than \$100.00.

On May 18, 2010, Deputy First Class A. Whipkey conducted a traffic stop on a 2007 Hyundai for speeding. The operator of the vehicle was identified as Shannyn Elizabeth Dulemba, age 26 of California, and the passenger was identified as Michael Connell Bush, age 40 of Lexington Park. Both Dulemba and Bush were extremely nervous during Deputy First Class

Whipkey's initial contact. Deputy First Class Rishel and his canine partner arrived on the scene and conducted a canine scan of the vehicle. Deputy First Class Rishel's canine partner is trained in narcotics detection. The canine alerted for suspected narcotics contained in the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted and two metal smoking devices, containing suspected cocaine residue, were located inside of the vehicle. Dulemba and Bush were arrested and charged with Possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance (suspected cocaine) and Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance Paraphernalia.

On May 18, 2010, Corporal V. Walker responded to a residence on Liberty Street in Lexington Park for a report of an assault. Corporal Walker made contact with the victim who was outside of the residence when she arrived. The victim reported he was in a verbal altercation with Terelle Lewis Martin, age 21 of Lexington Park, which escalated into a physical assault when Martin bit him in the chest. Corporal Walker contacted Martin inside of the residence. As Corporal Walker was speaking with Martin she observed a glass smoking device containing suspected marijuana residue in plain view on the living room coffee table. Martin was arrested and charged with Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance Paraphernalia and Second Degree Assault.

On May 18, 2010, Deputy M. Worrey responded to a residence on Sue Drive in Lexington Park for a report of an assault in progress. Upon arrival Deputy Worrey observed Dexter Golden Gantt, age 44 of Lexington Park, arguing with the victim inside a bedroom in the residence. The victim was bleeding from behind her ear. The victim reported she was in a verbal dispute with Gantt which escalated into a physical assault when Gantt slapped the victim in the face several times, pushed her to the ground and choked her. The victim sustained a laceration behind her ear and a swollen eye. Gantt was arrested and charged with Second Degree Assault.

On May 18, 2010, the victim responded to the Sheriff's Office and reported to Deputy H. Adams that he was in a verbal dispute earlier in the evening with Katherine Collins Loreda, age 34 of Hollywood, which escalated into a physical assault when Loreda struck the victim several times in the head and face with her fists. As a result of Loreda's assault, the victim suffered a laceration to his ear. The victim was able to flee the residence and drive to the Sheriff's Office to report the assault. Deputy Adams responded to Loreda's residence and interviewed her. Based on the deputy's investigation Loreda was arrested and charged with Second Degree Assault. As a result of Loreda's assault, the victim applied for and was granted an Interim Protective Order against Loreda. Loreda was served with the Interim Protective Order at the St. Mary's County Detention Center. The Protective Order ordered Loreda not to have any contact with the victim. After being served with the Protective Order, Loreda violated the conditions of the Protective Order by calling the victim. As a result of the contact, Loreda was also charged with Violating the Conditions of a Protective Order.

On May 18, 2010, Deputy T. Seyfried responded to a residence on Rosewood Drive in Lexington Park for a report of an assault. Upon arrival Deputy Seyfried made contact with the victim who was visibly upset. The victim reported she was in a verbal dispute with Joseph Alphonsus Saxon Jr., age 32 of Lexington Park, which escalated into a physical assault when Saxon punched her in the face. The victim also reported Saxon continued to strike her in the head, chest and ribs. The victim reported to Deputy Seyfried that she had trouble breathing and pain in her rib area. Deputy Seyfried summoned an ambulance and the victim was transported to St. Mary's Hospital. Saxon had fled the residence prior to the deputy's arrival but was subsequently located a short time later in the area. Saxon was arrested and charged with Second Degree Assault.

On May 18, 2010, Deputy C. Ellis stopped a 2007 Dodge Caliber. The operator of the vehicle identified as Ashley Nicole Thomas, age 22 of Lusby, failed to come to a complete stop for a stop sign near the intersection of Chancellor's Run Road and Pegg Road in Lexington Park. The passenger of the vehicle was identified as Mandy Brooke Lane, age 21 of Lexington Park. As Deputy Ellis was speaking with Thomas and Lane he observed a clear plastic baggie

containing suspected marijuana. Deputy Ellis conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle and located a bottle containing suspected cocaine in the glove box and a glass smoking device under the driver's seat. Both Thomas and Lane were arrested. A search of Lane's person also revealed a plastic baggie containing Clonazepam, a prescription drug, on her person. Lane did not have a prescription for the Clonazepam. As a result of the deputy's investigation, Thomas was charged with one count of Possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance and one count of Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance Paraphernalia. Lane was charged with three counts of Possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance and one count of Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance Paraphernalia.

On May 19, 2010, Corporal A. Delozier observed an unoccupied suspicious Ford passenger vehicle sitting on a dirt road in a wooded area in Hollywood. Corporal Delozier ran the registration to the vehicle through the Maryland Department of Motor Vehicles and contacted the owner. The owner advised she lent her vehicle to Jeffrey Hall Kirby, age 47 of Hollywood. As Corporal Delozier was waiting for the owner of the vehicle to respond to the scene, Kirby exited the wood line. For officer safety, Corporal Delozier conducted a pat-down of Kirby and discovered a smoking device containing suspected cocaine residue on Kirby's person. Kirby was arrested and charged with Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substance Paraphernalia.

On May 16, 2010, Deputy E. Croyle responded to a residence on Sam's Way in Lexington Park for a report of a theft. The victim reported that on May 9, 2010, Peter Lewis Orazio, age 21 of no fixed address, stole U.S. Currency and property totaling over \$2,000.00 from his residence. The victim is familiar with Orazio. Upon discovering the theft on May 9, 2010, the victim contacted Orazio and told him to return the items. Orazio never returned the items. Deputy Croyle located and interviewed Orazio about the theft. As a result of Deputy Croyle's investigation, Orazio was arrested and charged with Theft.

Vice/Narcotics Detectives began an investigation into Abujuma Nader, a.k.a. "Nick", and the possible distribution of prescription medication. After a several-month investigation, a Search and Seizure Warrant was executed on his residence in Mechanicsville. More than \$15,000.00 worth of oxycontin and oxycodone were recovered. Another co-conspirator, William James Jordon, age 33, is currently wanted for Possession With Intent to Distribute Prescription Medication. Judith Ann Labille, age 38 of Mechanicsville, was arrested on an open Grand Jury Indictment for Possession of Oxycodone With the Intent to Distribute. She was originally held without bond.

James Roshawn Garrett, age 28 of Hollywood, was identified as a distributor of "crack" cocaine and detectives began an investigation into his criminal activity. Undercover purchases of cocaine and handguns were conducted. Garrett was indicted by the Grand Jury for St. Mary's County and arrested. He is awaiting an arraignment in the Circuit Court.

Brian O'Neil Hicks, age 27, was identified as a distributor of cocaine in the Lexington Park area. Undercover operations were conducted and officers made purchases of cocaine and a handgun. Hicks was arrested and awaiting an arraignment.
